FIBRES & TEXTILES in Eastern Europe



Prof. Lubos Hes, PhD, DSc, D.h.c., FTI (hon)

Professor Hes worked for 16 years at the Textile Machinery Institute in Liberec, Czech Republic as a designer of yarn texturising and finishing machines, and later entered Czech University of Liberec, Faculty of Textiles, where he currently teaches clothing comfort and heat and mass transfer in textiles. His research interests also include technical textiles and the design of textile testing instruments. Prof. Hes has authored more than 80 peer-reviewed papers and delivered more than 300 communications at conferences. He is currently a member of Editorial Boards of 6 international textile journals and serves as an examiner of PhD studies in Germany, Portugal and India. Prof. Hes has been awarded 65 patents and his instruments for the testing of clothing comfort are used in 22 countries. In 2010 he received the highest Manchester Textile Institute award – Honorary Fellowship.

In 2011 he was awarded with an honorary doctorate and in 2012 with a full professorship by Wuhan Textile University in China. In 2016 he received an award from the Czech government for the design and manufacture of his instruments.
